

MSU Museum of Art Pavilion Wichita Falls, Texas

BYSP Architects has led the master-planning and implementation of 5 projects at the Museum of Art at Midwestern State University over the past 25 years and the latest project entailed the design and construction of exterior improvements.

The Priddy Pavilion at the lake at the Museum has become an iconic symbol of public art for the university and provides an exciting outdoor venue for music at the lake. Seating 120 including an adjacent patio for dinner theater, the facility has also provided a perfect setting for weddings, family gatherings and outdoor symphony.

Designed to blend the built environment with the natural, this creative sculpture has developed its own identity in the community. Built of wood, concrete and steel, the organic structure appears to rise out of the water to welcome and shelter the public. Also included in the project was a separate dining /reception terrace overlooking Sikes Lake.
